- Develops and implements a comprehensive guidance and counseling program based on State and Consortium standards; provides leadership and collaborates with administrators, educators, and stakeholders in the integration of the counseling program; collects and analyze data to guide program direction; and measure results of the guidance and counseling program activities and shares results with relevant administrators and stakeholders
- Adheres to laws, policies, procedures, and ethical standards of the school counseling profession
- Provides individual and group counseling to students with identified concerns and needs; utilizes appropriate assessment procedures to determine and structure individual and group counseling services
- Assists teachers, parents/guardians, and other stakeholders in interpreting and understanding student data
- Implements developmentally appropriate and prevention-oriented services to meet students' needs and goals; facilitates crisis intervention, as needed, to ensure student/school safety; provides peer mediation as needed
- Consults and collaborates with parents/guardians, teachers, administrators, and other community agencies and resources to address students' concerns, needs, and progress

- Implements referral processes and provides follow-up to schools, community agencies, and Consortium administrators
- Assists students with developing academic, social, emotional, and/or career plans; collaborates with parents/guardians, teacher, and community service providers to discuss students' educational plans and progress
- Monitors academic performance, attendance, and behavior to identify and facilitate appropriate interventions
- Assists in registration, course selection, student scheduling; oversees dual enrollment and credit recovery programs
- Assists students with college, career, and military preparation: completes scholarship and financial aid forms; provides letters of recommendation; coordinates and schedules college visits; coordinates college admissions test preparation; and coordinates college and military recruiter visits
- Assists students with career development and job placements
- Participates in professional development activities to enhance job knowledge, skills, and abilities
- Performs any other duties within the scope of employment and certification, as assigned by the Principal and not otherwise prohibited by law or in conflict with contract to ensure the efficient and effective operation of the school
